School Supply List 2011-12



FIFTH GRADE

STUDENTS WILL NEED THE FOLLOWING ITEMS FOR THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL:

- 1 Student plan book (*must be purchased through the school while supplies last*) \$5.00 each
- 4-8 #2 pencils (*required for standardized testing*)
- 1-2 Pink erasers
- 2-3 Blue or black pens (*medium or fine point / no flairs, gel pens, roller ball, or multicolored pens*)
- 2 Red pens (*medium or fine point / no flairs, gel pens, roller ball, or multicolored pens*)
- 1 Pencil bag (*no boxes, please*)
- 1 Pack of 3x5 index cards (100 pack - *will need more throughout the school year*)
- 3 Looseleaf notebook paper (*8 ½ X 11, must be **Wide-Ruled, No College Rule, please***)
- 3 Spiral notebooks – wide ruled (*single-subject*) (For Spanish, Math and Science)
- 1 Composition book
- 2 Tissue boxes
- 1 Expanding file folder to hold papers for 8 subjects or more
- 1 Folder for Spanish class
- 1 Protractor- later in year
- 1 12 inch ruler with standard and metric measures
- 3 Looseleaf notebook paper (**10 ½ x 8, College Ruled- Student's in Mrs. Samonte's Math only**)
- 2-3 Highlighters (pink, green, blue and yellow)

The following items are not required, but are greatly appreciated throughout the school year.

- Tissue Boxes
- Disinfectant wipes
- Hand sanitizer
- Scissors
- Crayola Markers (both thin and thick)
- Crayola colored pencils

Other supplies may be needed throughout the year. Teacher will send a note requesting additional supplies when they are needed.

CHILDREN SHOULD HAVE A BACK-PACK OR TOTE BAG TO CARRY THEIR SUPPLIES BACK AND FORTH TO SCHOOL. Please remember that all textbooks must be covered.

Earthquake Kits

Each child is required to bring his or her own Earthquake Kit by Friday, September 9th. The kit should be placed in an 11" X 11" zip lock freezer bag. The child's full name and grade should be on the outside of the bag. Each kit should consist of the following:

1. Three fruit rolls
2. Three granola bars
3. Two small cans of juice (they must be cans, boxes will leak)
4. One small pop-top can of meat or fish
5. One small game or toy
6. A supportive letter or photo
7. One space or solar blanket (can be purchased at Big 5 or any place where camping equipment is sold)
8. Pre-K through Third Grade - One change of underwear

We cannot stress enough the importance of these kits. The kits are kept until the last day of school, then they are sent home.
